## Devotional by Laurie Cummings Jesus Will Answer

Psalms 91: (from which the hymn "On Angels' Wings" was inspired) "Whoever dwells in the shelter of the Most High will rest in the shadow of the Almighty. I will say of the LORD, "He is my refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust." Surely he will save you from the fowler's snare and from the deadly pestilence.

He will cover you with his feathers, and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness will be your shield and rampart. You will not fear the terror of night, nor the arrow that flies by day, nor the pestilence that stalks in the darkness, nor the plague that destroys at midday. A thousand may fall at your side, ten thousand at your right hand, but it will not come near you. You will only observe with your eyes and see the punishment of the wicked. If you say, "The LORD is my refuge," and you make the Most High your dwelling, no harm will overtake you, no disaster will come near your tent. For he will command his angels concerning you to guard you in all your ways; they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone. You will tread on the lion and the cobra; you will trample the great lion and the serpent. "Because he loves me," says the LORD, "I will rescue him; I will protect him, for he acknowledges my name. He will call on me, and I will answer him; I will be with him in trouble, I will deliver him and honor him. With long life I will satisfy him and show him my salvation."

A poor Chinese woman was cutting grass with her baby on her back. All of a sudden she saw a tiger and her two cubs. As the tiger charged the woman, and with no one in sight to help, she called out, "O, Jesus, help me!" The tiger halted, turned, and ran away with her cubs running behind her.

What "beasts" attack you? Health, finances, depression, loneliness, sadness, etc? The Psalm tells us that He will be our refuge; He will rescue and protect us; He will deliver us. Reach out to Him. Ask for His help with the beasts in your life. Jesus will answer. That does not mean our lives will be free from all problems, pain, or heartache. It does mean that He will be by our side, loving us, helping us through life and promising He will always be with us, and someday we will be with Him in Heaven, where there are no more beasts!
